Council notes the potential change to Committee membership numbers, following the result of the Newsham by election, and any resulting action to take place.

To ensure a balanced representation of Councillors on committees. There are no financial impacts to this report.

<u>Objective</u>

To promote good governance and ensure an effective and well-functioning democracy at all levels.

Report

The current methodology of determining the numbers, by Political group etc, on each of the Committees is based upon their total number of representatives over the 16 members of the Council, e.g. if a Political group had 12 representatives, then they would have 75% of the places available on the main committees. This does not mean necessarily having 75% on each committee, they may choose to have more membership on one committee than the others. Current practice is, as best as can be done, to have equal representation on each committee.

At the beginning of this current Council, for the main 3 committees there were 39 seats to fill. The split within the Council, at the time of the 2021 election, was 10 Labour, 4 Conservatives and 2 Liberal Democrats. This resulted in 24, 10 and 5, places respectively.

As a by election has been called in the Newsham ward, due to the resignation of one of the two Councillors, this may result in a different split for the committee seats available, as shown below:
