Recommendation

Consider and recommend the Environment Committee budget for 2025/26 to the Governance Committee, for further consideration and recommendation to Council.

Risk Analysis

An Environment Committee budget must be set for the next financial year to sit alongside other Committee's to ensure the finance available for services and ultimately the setting of the Council Tax.

Objective

To promote good governance of the Town Council by adopting transparent practices and promoting public participation.

Report

The preparation of the budget for 2025/26 has been carried out based on:

- rolling forward the services we are currently providing.
- consideration of the Play Area refurbishment programme.
- looking at budgets to reflect savings where we can, without having a material effect on service.

The Committee's proposed budget is summarised in the table below, with the detail shown on Appendix 1.

As you will see there is an underspend in 2024/25 between the Budget and Probable of some £69k.

This is in the main, due to savings of:

A significant reduction in the proposed budget for 2025/26 of £182k mainly comes from the capital expenditure relating to the Skate Park Scheme, Allotment improvements alongside bringing forward the proposal to refurbish another play area, net £200k.

Members will see that, for the purposes of this report, that I have rolled forward the NCC Partnership Budget.

A significant amount of work has been undertaken by both the Partnership Board and this Committee, in relation to the Partnership Agreement with Northumberland County Council. Changes have been proposed and the detail of these proposals are subject to a separate report, and any changes to the recommended budget included within this report will be subsequently reflected as such.
