4 Actions arising from previous Minutes

4.1 Defibrillators – the Town Clerk agreed to provide information on the usage of the existing defibrillators – **please see**Information Report, agenda item 9.

5 Environment Budget Monitoring Report

Queries were raised on the following:

Water Rates – Bolam – the GSO clarified the rates have increased as there have been some water leaks and it there is an issue with the location of the stopcock. This has been raised with Northumbria Water.

297 Allotments Planned Maintenance Programme – noted that the Town Clerk will investigate this further. The amount queried related to a creditor from the previous financial year and this has been correctly accounted for.

6 Decision Report 1

Committee considered the recommendations set out in the Decision Report and **RESOLVED:**

To agree the costs to replace the boundary fences on plots where they are required in order to let an allotment. Responsibility would then revert to the allotment holder.

To accept the Shipyard Flats Sculpture as a BTC asset following installation. Cllr Nisbet is funding this project from her MLIS.

To accept the 8 bins at the Mermaid Car Park as BTC assets following installation. The GSO showed the designs for the wrap arounds being used on the bins.

To agree to the refurbishment of ten seats using the same kind of hardwood materials that were used on the Quay side seats in the above locations at a cost of £3200.00 from Contractor 1. To investigate further the option of purchasing

seats manufactured using recycled materials in future schemes.

To carry out a consultation with residents to establish if they would support a new play area on land in Chestnut Avenue instead of refurbishing the current Millfield Gardens Play area in 2023/24.. Officers will explore with NCC whether this is a viable option. Residents will also be consulted on the planned refurbishment of Millfield Gardens.

Noted that Chase Farm needs to be added to the refurbishment programme.

To relocate the Skate Park due to the current problems with the existing one and this will be factored into the 2022/23 budget at a cost of £103,000 which includes £15,000 to reinstate the land on the original location. A consultation exercise will be carried out.

To purchase four additional CCTV cameras requested by the police as and when they are needed.

7 Decision Report 2 – Budget 2022/23

Committee agreed to the recommendation to take the budget to Governance with the following changes:

- 1. Noted the costs for the new skate park and reinstating the original land will be included in the 2022/23 budget.
- 2. Reconsider the figure for Laverock Place water rates.

The following was clarified:

CCTV recovery of footage – explained how the costs are incurred.

War memorials – costs are for cleaning of the war memorials and general maintenance.
