6	<p>Blyth Food Bank Review</p> <p>The Town Clerk gave a verbal presentation on his report regarding the Food Bank.</p> <p>RESOLVED that a further donation of £5,000 be made to Blyth Food Bank and that a further review take place in six-month time.</p>

	<p>Discussion and Decisions regarding Funding Applications</p> <p>Members further discussed the individual applications and the following grant payments were agreed.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Blossoming Communities was approved funding of £5,000 to contribute to the weekly wellbeing arts and crafts workshops that run at St Mary's Church Hall in Blyth.

	<p>2. Community Food and Friendship Blyth was approved funding of £4,800 towards core costs (so that can continue to support the users, upskill them growing their confidence)</p> <p>3. Headway Arts was approved funding of £5,000 to contribute towards core costs to maintain a dynamic creative offer for the people of Blyth and to support the ongoing development of the building as a community arts and cultural centre.</p> <p>4. Leading Link was approved funding of £5,000. The funding will be used to focus on young people and their needs to gain experience, upskilling and training in line with the Young Leader Model.</p> <p>5. Loud Arts CIC was approved funding of £5,000 to deliver Community Voices Chair plus Makaton Sessions in the community.</p> <p>6. SENRUG (The South East Northumberland Rail User Group) was not approved funding as members did not feel it was appropriate to support campaign.</p> <p>A total of £24,800 was approved for the above-mentioned organisations and groups.</p> <p>The meetings closed at 7.10 pm</p>
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The above Sub-Committee is delegated with the management and development of the council’s grant scheme and has the power to resolve any individual applications **without** recourse to the standing Committee.
